Pour out on us the spirit of love and compassion.

Enable us to reverence each person, to reach out to anyone in need,

To value and appreciate those who differ from us,

To share the resources of our nation, to receive the gifts offered to us by people from other cultures.

Grant that we may always promote the justice and acceptance that ensures harmony.

Help us to remember that we are one world and one family.

We pay our respects to each family in our school.

May we all celebrate the beauty of our land Australia.

May we acknowledge and accept our cultural heritage.

May we be a strong community of respect.

May the parish community, parents and teachers be strong beacons of light, hope and




