At the moment we will be proceeding with our Open morning for prospective families on **Wednesday 19 August commencing at 9.30 am.** Bookings will be essential with limited numbers.

COVID-19

We continue to follow COVID-19 health and safety guidelines and follow advice received from Catholic Education Diocese of Parramatta. We will update our families via our Skoolbag App as new information is provided to us.

- Teachers are reminding students how to wash hands.
- There are soap dispensers in the toilets, and these are topped up regularly. Signs have been placed in classrooms and toilets to remind and demonstrate hand washing procedures.
- Each class has been provided with hand sanitizer pumps.
- Teachers continue to be vigilant with monitoring and acting regarding children who appear to be unwell.
- If a student presents as unwell at school, they will be isolated from other students and staff in the sick bay or an area of the office. Parents will be contacted to collect their child.
- The school has discouraged handshakes, hugs and kisses.
- Additional cleaning is taking place.

Keeping children with nut allergies safe

We have a number of children who have nut allergies. *Anaphylaxis* is the most severe form of an allergic reaction, and is life threatening. Just a reminder to all parents to please ensure that you do not send any nut products into school with your children. Thank you for your support in helping to keep these allergy children safe. More information on allergy awareness is included in this newsletter.

Chapel Lane—Afternoon pick up—Slow & Go

We have been contacted by the Hills Shire Council regarding parents from the school queuing on Chapel Lane for the afternoon Slow & Go pickup.

This impacts safety at the bus bay at Crestwood High School and queues also extend into the No Stopping areas beyond the bus bay.

We have been asked to remind parents who use the Slow & Go pickup area that you should arrive after the gates open and not before to reduce the queuing and illegal parking along Chapel Lane.

The 'No Parking' signage on Chapel Lane allows vehicles to stop for no more than 2 minutes and within 3 metres of their vehicle with fines of \$191 and 2 demerit points applicable in school zones for those who do not follow these rules. Included with this newsletter are flyers regarding the No Parking restrictions.

Parents using the Slow & Go school pickup areas must not be queueing here for long periods of time every afternoon. Please plan your arrival time so as to minimise queuing on Chapel Lane.

If you wish to arrive early before the gates open for vehicles you can park in another area and walk in to the school to collect your child/children.

Council Compliance Officers will be providing enforcement on Chapel Lane.

Reading, Writing, Spelling

I draw your attention to the following information regarding how parents can help their children with reading, writing and spelling.

"You make a difference to your children's reading journey. Your role as an advocate for your children's reading success cannot be overestimated. It has a direct impact on the ease and confidence with which they pursue their reading and writing. It is the joy and love of sharing a good book on a nightly basis that sets the foundation for their reading success, and ensures that reading is given the priority it deserves. Reading regularly with someone who cares is the inspiration that all readers deserve.

Learning to spell—What we need to know

Spelling is a tool for writing. Reading, writing and spelling are interconnected. Readers and writers are constantly building up images of how words look. Writers become conscious users and consumers of words. They take notice of words in the books they read and the words they see in their environment.

Good spellers are resourceful. When they notice that a word does not look right, they experiment and substitute other letters, find the word in a book, a magazine, the environment, the dictionary, use the spell checker, or ask someone.

Every writing time is a spelling time. Writers compose for meaning first and foremost. They proofread to ensure the intended message is conveyed accurately and appropriately for their intended reader.

Teachers vary the way they teach spelling."

"Parents' guide to helping children with reading and writing at home," Kaye Lowe, PETAA, Primary English Teaching Association

Spelling is a tool for writing, and when we spell words, we draw on the four forms of spelling knowledge, these being:

- Phonology—how we sound words
- Visual—how words look
- Morphology—parts within words that signify meaning, grammar
- Etymology—the historical, cultural origin of words.

Students need to write every day including a variety of writing activities in a range of contexts, leading to the ultimate goal of becoming better spellers and writers. Student spelling lists do not improve through disconnected weekly spelling lists (or tests).

Spelling is a tool for writing and this is the best place to teach spelling, in the reading-writing classroom, not in a separate lesson that often consists of drill and practice of words that have little significance for students.


Catholic Education Office leaving the school policy

IMPORTANT ALLERGY INFORMATION

At St Michael's we have a number of children with **life threatening allergies** (Anaphylaxis) to various forms of food, latex, dust, animals and insect stings.

Some children have allergies that are so severe that smells or touch could trigger a reaction.

In particular, we have a number of children who have severe allergies to nuts. While allergic reactions are common and most are not serious, for some people the reaction can be life-threatening. Anaphylaxis and can occur within minutes of an exposure to a trigger.

We see prevention as a major part of providing a safe environment for these children. <u>In order to support these children</u>, <u>we ask that you do not send in nuts or any foods containing nuts to the school with your children</u>.

Common foods that trigger an allergic reaction are listed below and we ask you to be 'nut aware' and refrain from sending them to school and to seek suitable alternatives. The following list gives examples of such foods:

FOOD TYPE	EXAMPLES
Peanuts / peanut butter	Any kind of peanut or peanut butter
Tree nuts	Hazelnuts, almonds, cashews, pecans, walnuts, macadamia – any kind of nuts
Sesame seeds	
Nutella	Any brand
Biscuits containing or topped with nuts	Particularly chocolate biscuits
Cakes or slices containing nuts	
Snack packs containing nuts	Dried fruit + nut mixes
Chocolates containing nuts	Picnics, Snickers, Mars Bars (almond), Nut Breaks, Ferrero Rocher, Fruit and Nut, Praline based chocolates – Guylian, Marble Blocks
Chocolate lollies containing nuts	Peanut M&Ms
Marzipan and nougat	
Breakfast cereals containing nuts	Crunchy Nut or Honey Nut Cornflakes, Muesli, Nutri Grain, Just Right etc
Muesli Bars and Snack Bars containing nuts	
Yoghurt with nut mixer packs	
Confectionary items	Lolly Gobble Bliss Bombs, Rocky Road
"Health Food" confectionary bars containing nuts	Uncle Toby's yoghurt muesli bars
Foods containing satay	Thai, Malaysian, Indonesian meals

The Canteen does not sell any of these products.

In the case of a child bringing a nut product to school, teachers will bring the matter to the attention of parents.

There are many foods that DO NOT contain peanuts or nuts in their ingredients list, but the food package has the statement. "May contain traces of dairy, nut or seed". This food may be brought to school and consumed only by non-allergic children.

Due to safety and concerns, we discourage children from sharing food and drink. We would also appreciate parents speaking to their children regarding this matter. Your child's diet at home need not change.

Below is a list of foods that are safe for you to choose from. We're sure you can think of many others.

- Fruit and vegetables
- Dried fruits, Fruit snack packs
- Vegemite, jam, honey, cheese spreads
- Parker's Pretzels, Rice crackers
- Chips, Popcorn
- Plain biscuits sweet or savoury without nuts
- Chocolate biscuits without nuts
- Plain Cornflakes, Rice Bubbles, Weetbix, etc without nuts
- Fruit based muesli bars and snack bars without nuts
- Yoghurt without nuts mixes
- Lollies and confectionary items marshmallow, spearmint leaves, jelly babies, snakes, raspberries, etc without nuts.

Basically we ask you not to send food to school with your child that contains a nut or nut product listed in ingredients.

We thank you for helping us to provide a safe environment for all children at St Michael's.

2020 Sacramental News...

Confirmation - Parish of Baulkham Hills



The Sacrament of Confirmation is available to all children of the Parish who are 10/11 years of age or older and who have received the Sacraments of Penance and Eucharist.

Children must be at least 10½ at the time of the celebration of the Sacrament.

Our Sacramental Programs will be run a little differently this year for both St Michael's and Our Lady of Lourdes communities.

There will be **NO ENROLMENT WEEKEND**. We have decided to cancel the enrolment weekend as attendance by families will cause the COVID 19 restrictions in each church (currently 100) to be exceeded.

- Registration will be online and it will be assumed, by registering, that you and your child will commit yourselves to this program.
- Preparation for the Sacrament will be via online YOUTUBE videos. These short videos are mainly for parents use only, outlining briefly what is expected each week. Links to these videos will be sent weekly.
- Parents and children are asked to then work through the Children's activity workbook, "The Sacrament of Confirmation", which will be available via the School or from the Parish Office.
- There may be questions or issues which you want to discuss. An opportunity will be provided toward the end of the program via ZOOM.
- Please keep an eye on your emails for links and information related to the program.

The 2020 Confirmation Program will run as follows:


- Week 1 starting August 10

Alpha: The Couch Edition!


