## "Tell Them From Me" Survey

Thank you to the 74 families who took part in the "Tell Them From Me" Survey. The questionnaire covered several aspects of parents' perceptions of their children's experiences at school and home. We are grateful to our families for their feedback which will help us review our policies and procedures—what is working well and what we can improve. ## Classes for 2021

Early next term our teachers will be working together to formulate our classes for 2021. Our goal is to form parallel, even class groups in each grade.

The teachers look at the learning needs of each student, their behaviour and their social, emotional needs.

If you believe your child has any of the above needs which should be considered for their placement in a class for 2021, please put this information into a letter to the Principal.

This is not an invitation for you to nominate your child's teacher. It is however, an opportunity to highlight any special needs that will help the teachers form class groups for 2021.

Teachers will also provide the children with an opportunity to nominate 2 or 3 friends that they would like to be with in 2021. The school will endeavour to have at least one of their friends progress with them if this is in your child's best interest.

On Wednesday 16 December at 2.00 pm our children will have the opportunity to meet their 2021 teacher together with their new classmates.

## Day for Daniel—Friday 30 October

Day for Daniel is Australia's largest day of action to raise awareness of child safety, protection, and harm prevention. Held annually on the last Friday of October, Day for Daniel honours the memory of Daniel Morcombe.

The theme is Wear Red, Educate and Donate.

On this day the children can wear something red with their sports uniform—a red ribbon, a red shirt, red socks, etc.

Parents, carers, and educators are encouraged to start a conversation with children and young people about personal safety. Schools and early learning centres conduct child safety education activities. Businesses and community come together to raise awareness of child safety issues.

Day for Daniel is the Daniel Morcombe Foundation's biggest fundraiser each year. Your support through fundraising helps us to continue developing free resources and programs for parents, carers, and educators to teach children how to stay safe. 
