2021 Kindergarten Orientation

Congratulations and thank you to our staff who organised the Primary Sports Day last Tuesday. We were blessed once again with beautiful weather.

Slow & Go - Chapel Lane

We have been contacted by the Hills Shire Council regarding our parents queueing in the timed 'No Parking ' areas, No Stopping areas and Bus Zone/Bay on Chapel Lane as our parents wait for Slow & Go to begin each afternoon.

The queues waiting on Chapel Lane every afternoon before the commencement of Slow & Go are impacting on safety for Crestwood HS students as parents often wait in No Stopping areas near the HS Bus Bay and queue around the Bus Bay.

We remind our parents that you cannot 'park' in the "No Parking area on Chapel Lane while you wait for the Slow & Go to begin. 'No Parking' restrictions means you can wait for no more than 2 minutes and remain within 3 metres of your vehicle.

We encourage you to arrive at the time, or after Slow & Go commences, no earlier, so that traffic can then flow off Chapel Lane into the school so that these long queues of up to 350 metres can be avoided each afternoon. Council's Compliance Officers have observed some parents arriving 45 minutes before Slow & Go begins at 3.20 pm.

Council's Compliance Officers enforce all parking restrictions around the school and parents who 'park' and wait in the 'No Parking' zones or wait in 'No Stopping' zones and 'Bus Zones' can be fined and incur demerit points.

COVID-19

Our staff continue to be vigilant with monitoring and acting regarding children who appear to be unwell. Please keep your child at home if you think they are sick, runny nose, cough, headache etc. If a child presents as unwell at school, they will be isolated from other children and staff in the sick bay or an area of the office. Parents will be contacted to collect their child immediately and children will need to undergo a COVID-19 test before they can return to school. We understand that this may be difficult but it is in the best interests of the school community as a whole.

As a school, at St Michael's we continue to promote personal hygiene for all our students and staff including:

- Washing of hands frequently with soap and water.
- Using the hand sanitiser. (Hand sanitisers in all spaces.)
- Covering their nose and mouth when coughing or sneezing.
- Avoiding touching their face.
- Placing used tissues straight into the bin.
- Daily clean of all surfaces and touch points by cleaners.
- Increasing the amount of fresh air available indoors by opening windows and doors.
- Students bringing their own water bottles with their names clearly labelled.
- Discouraging handshakes, hugs and kisses.

Swimming Carnival Years 3-6 Tuesday 1 December

The vast majority of children will be going on the bus from school to the Swimming Carnival. The only children who are not going on the bus are those children who are competing in the 100 m freestyle and 200 m individual medley who are required to be at the venue at 8.15 am.

Unfortunately, parents are unable to enter the Swimming Centre. Children cannot be collected by parents from the Swimming Centre.

Every child will return to school on the bus.

School Swimming Program Years 1, 2 & 3

The Swimming Program for Years 1, 2 and 3, and will take place in Week 9, **Monday 7 December to Friday 11 December**. The program will be held at Castle Hill Fitness & Aquatic Centre, Castle Hill RSL. Castle Hill Fitness and Aquatic Centre and St Michael's have COVID safety plans in place.

On the first day of swimming your child will be grouped according to the information you've supplied on the Grading Form that was sent home last week. Children will then be assessed and regrouped accordingly.

All children must attend the Swimming Program. Due to COVID restrictions parents are unable to attend the centre.

The children in Years 1, 2 & 3 are to wear their sport or summer uniform each day during the program.

The children will need to bring a plastic bag or swimming bag containing the following items:

- Swimming costume
- Towel
- t-shirt or long sleeved top (to wear to and from the pool on the bus)
- Thongs or sandals (to wear to and from the pool)
- Goggles
- Dry underwear
- Swimming caps will be provided by the centre

All items should be clearly labelled with your child's name and class. Further information will be sent home to our families shortly.

Families leaving St Michael's at the end of the year

If your family is not returning to St Michael's for Years 1-6 in 2021, please let Mrs Maka, Principal, know as soon as possible. Please address all letters/emails to Mrs Maka c/o the school office. This will assist with placing students in classes for 2021.

Please note If you are leaving the school at the end of the year in Years K-5, parents must provide one term's notice in writing in lieu of one term's school fee payment.

If you are collecting your children around Recess or Lunch, we suggest you let the school office know prior to, or after, Recess and Lunch times.

Please choose carefully as we do not refund if you simply change your mind or make a wrong selection, however, we gladly exchange within 14 days.

Returned merchandise MUST be in its original condition with all tags still attached and accompanied by proof of purchase otherwise the exchange will not be honoured. Any item that has been worn will not be able to be exchanged.

SCHOOL ZONE PARKING RULES AND PENALTIES

COUNCIL'S COMPLIANCE OFFICERS ENFORCE PARKING SIGNS AT YOUR SCHOOL.

When it comes to the safety of vulnerable road users like school children, drivers found breaking the law will be met with zero tolerance. When an offence is detected, you will be fined.



NO STOPPING

You must not STOP at any time.

Stopping includes when the vehicle is not moving but the engine is still running.

SCHOOL ZONE

Penalty from \$344 and 2 demerit points



NO PARKING

You can stop only to drop off or pick up passengers or goods and you must not stop for more than 2 minutes and The driver must stay within 3 metres of your vehicle. Stopping includes when the vehicle is not moving but the engine is still running.

SCHOOL ZONE

Penalty from \$191 and 2 demerit points



BUS ZONES

You must not stop your vehicle in a Bus Zone unless you are driving a public bus. Stopping includes when the vehicle is not moving but the engine is still running.

SCHOOL ZONE

Penalty from \$344 and 2 demerit points



DRIVEWAYS

You must not park your car over or block access to a driveway. You can stop in a driveway to drop off or pick up passengers BUT only for less than 2 minutes AND the driver must stay with the car.

SCHOOL ZONE

Penalty from \$344 and 2 demerit points



THERE ARE NOW INCREASED PENALTIES AND DEMERIT POINTS ASSOCIATED WITH ALL OFFENCES IN SCHOOL ZONES.



NO PARKING

You have no more than 2 minutes for drop-offs or pick-ups and must stay within 3 metres of your vehicle.

Penalty from \$191 and 2 demerit points



NO STOPPING

Under no cicumstances are you permitted to stop on a length of road to which a No Stopping Sign applies.

Penalty from \$344 and 2 demerit points



BUS ZONE

You must not stop your vehicle in the indicated zone unless you are driving a public bus.

Penalty from \$344 and 2 demerit points

Double parking

Stop on path or nature strip

Stop on / near marked pedestrian/children's crossing

Approach children's crossing too quickly to stop safely

Illegal U turns

Stop across driveway

Drive using a hand held mobile phone
