St Michael's—Changes to Outside of School Hours Care

St Michael's OOSH, run by a parent committee who donated their time to ensuring our families had childcare support, has now transitioned to the not-for-profit charity, Catholic Diocese of Parramatta Services Limited (CDPSL). St Michael's OOSH will now operate as a Catholic Outside School Hours Care Service (COSHC). CDPSL currently operates 32 early childhood services across the Diocese. These services collaborate closely with the schools to provide high quality pre-school, long day care, before and after school care and vacation care. Before and after school services currently provided by parent committees and private organisations in the Diocese of Parramatta are being progressively transitioned to CDPSL who will deliver the service.

The Diocese and the school are very grateful for the many years of wonderful care St Michael's OOSH has provided for families. Starting, growing and maintaining a childcare service is not an easy task and we have great admiration for the past and present committee members who have taken on this responsibility. They have selflessly given their time and talents for the benefit of the community. We hope they can proudly reflect on their legacy which has helped hundreds of parents, carers and children as they juggle the challenges of family, work and school commitments and their contribution to St Michael's which will be enjoyed for many generations to come.

CDPSL has spent time with the parent committee and the staff at St Michael's OOSH to ensure that the quality care currently provided by St Michael's OOSH continues. Bishop Vincent van Nguyen will be Opening and blessing St Michael's COSH on Tuesday 23 February.

Religious Education

This week we celebrate Ash Wednesday, the first day of one of the most important seasons in the Church's liturgical year - Lent. This is a time when we try to get closer to God. We encourage all children to think of things they can do to achieve this. For example, have conversations with God, do good deeds and give to Project Compassion. We understand these acts to be fasting, prayer and almsgiving.

Fasting is an ancient action linked to Lent and is considered a sacred act. The goal of fasting is connected to prayer. Our hunger for food reminds us of our hunger for God and prayer and fasting brings us to what Lent is about: a deeper conversion and relationship with God.

Prayer is our conversation with God. In these conversations we find the strength to fast, to develop a closer and more intimate relationship with God. This relationship makes us grateful for our many blessings, and motivates us to give to those less fortunate.

Almsgiving is a response we receive through prayer and fasting. It expresses our gratitude for all we have been given. We come to a realisation that we all make up the body of Christ and with this realisation that there is a responsibility to all who are parts of this body. This means that our acts of charity and the promotion of justice are essential elements to a Catholic way of life.


